Discussion Notes

Realized Weather- Country Reports (09-15 Feb. 24)	 Bangladesh experienced mild cold waves across the country with its northern region experiencing moderate cold waves. Myanmar experienced scattered rainfall over isolated places with much of the country remaining dry. Nepal mainly experienced partly cloudy to cloudy weather over the week with its northern highlands experiencing isolated and scattered rain/snow. Much of the Maldives experienced scattered showers with heavy rain on 12 February mainly in the southern and central atolls. 	
Significant Weather Features in the region for the coming week (16-22 Feb. 24)	 A westerly trough is prevailing over the Tibetan Plateau and adjoining areas. A cyclonic circulation lies over North Bangladesh in lower tropospheric levels and a trough in westerlies in middle tropospheric levels runs along Long. 83°E to the north of Lat. 24°N. A fresh Western Disturbance is likely to affect the western Himalayas and neighbourhoods from 17 February. A weak easterly wave is likely to persist over Sri Lanka, Maldives and adjoining areas. 	
Weather Outlook (16-22 Feb. 24)	 Pakistan is likely to experience mainly dry weather conditions with snow/rain over some highland areas. Bhutan and Nepal are likely to experience cloudy weather conditions with scattered light/moderate rain/snow over the northern and high hilly places with rain over some isolated places. Bangladesh is likely to remain dry with scattered rain after 20 February and Myanmar is likely to experience mainly dry weather conditions with isolated rain over some places. Maldives and Sri Lanka are likely to experience scattered light/moderate rain/thundershowers over some places. Also, strong winds are likely over the Maldives. 	Extended Range Outlook (until 28 February 2024) The western Himalayan region including highland areas of Bhutan, Nepal, Pakistan and northeast India likely to experience rain/snow with rest of the South Asia likely to experience less rain activity towards the week ending of 28 February.
Ocean Watch	Observed Ocean Surface Conditions (09-15 Feb. 24) No significant events were reported during the week. Forecast for the coming week (16-22 Feb. 24) While mostly normal sea conditions are likely to prevail, coastal areas of Maldives are likely to experience rough seas over the week.
