Discussion Notes

Realized Weather- Country Reports (01-07 Mar. 24)	 Pakistan experienced widespread heavy rain and snow. PMD issued press release warning of heavy rain and snow. Bhutan and Nepal experienced cloudy weather conditions with light scattered rain/snow over isolated high lands and hilly areas. Much of Myanmar experienced dry weather conditions with scattered rain/thundershowers over isolated places in the southern parts of the country. While much of Maldives experienced fair weather conditions, some places experienced isolated rain and thunderstorms with intermittent heavy thundershowers during the afternoons. 	
Significant Weather Features in the region for the coming week (08-14 Mar. 24)	 A Western Disturbance as a cyclonic circulation likely to prevail over northern Pakistan and adjoining areas. Successive Western Disturbances likely to affect western Himalayan region and parts of central and eastern Himalayas during 10 March and 12 March. A feeble easterly wave persisting over the neighbourhoods of Maldives. 	
Weather Outlook (08-14 Mar. 24)	 Pakistan is likely to experience moderate/heavy rain/snow with hailstorms over some places. Bhutan and Nepal are likely to experience cloudy weather conditions with scattered light/moderate rain/snow over the northern and high hilly places with rain over some isolated places. Much of Bangladesh likely to remain dry with scattered rain over some places. Also, Myanmar is likely to experience mainly dry weather conditions with isolated rain/thundershowers over some places. Maldives and Sri Lanka are likely to experience scattered light/moderate rain/thundershowers over some places with much of the countries likely to experience fair weather conditions. 	Extended Range Outlook (until 21 March 2024) Drier weather conditions likely to prevail over much of South Asia with Himalayan regions likely to experience light/moderate snow and rain towards the week ending of 21 March.
Ocean Watch	Observed Ocean Surface Conditions (01-07 Mar. 24) No significant events were reported during the week. Forecast for the coming week (08-14 Mar. 24) Normal sea conditions are likely to prevail over the week.
