Discussion Notes

Realized Weather (21-27 April 2022)	 Two shallow WDs passed over north of Afghanistan and Pakistan, and continental dry air prevailing over the rest of the regions of Afghanistan and Pakistan. Isolated and scattered rain/thundershowers observed over northern and central parts of Afghanistan and Pakistan with much of the areas experiencing dry weather conditions. Heatwave conditions are observed over some regions of Afghanistan and Pakistan from 25 April 2022 with some isolated places experiencing severe heat. The highest temperatures recorded during the last 24 hours over Pakistan were 44 °C at Chhor, 43 °C at Karachi and Mithi , and 42 °C at Shaheed Benazirabad, Lasbela, Rahim Yar Khan and Sibbi. Light to moderate rain/thundershowers observed over Nepal and Bhutan. No significant synoptic situations are observed over these regions. Westerly trough and south-westerly wind flows from Bay of Bengal persisting over Bangladesh. Isolated rain/thundershowers observed in some places with much of the country experiencing dry weather conditions. Feeble westerly trough prevailed over northern Myanmar and passing of easterly wave over southern region of the country. Under these influences isolated and scattered to fairly widespread rain/thundershowers observed over Sri Lanka and Maldives between 21 April and 24 April at lower tropospheric levels. Salient synoptic features in the coming week	 WD expected over Afghanistan and adjoining areas of Pakistan on 30 April 2022. Westerly trough prevailing over Bangladesh. Also, a strong south westerly wind from Bay of Bengal to north eastern region at lower tropospheric level is expected. A westerly trough seen over north Myanmar and easterly wave passing over southern region of the country.

	 North-South trough runs from Tamil Nadu to west of Sri Lanka at lowe tropospheric levels. 	
Rainfall outlook	 Isolated rain/thundershowers expected from 01 May 2022 mostly over northern regions of Afghanistan and Pakistan with dry weather conditions likely over rest of the areas. Isolated and scattered rain/thundershowers likely over Bhutan and Nepal with widespread activities expected from 01 May 2022. Isolated and scattered rain/thundershowers likely over Bangladesh with fairly widespread activities likely after 01 May 2022. Higher anomaly of rainfall expected over isolated places of Nepal, Bhutan, Myanmar, Bangladesh, South India and Sri Lanka towards the week ending of 10 May 2022.
Temperature outlook	 Heatwave conditions with severe heat in few places are likely to prevail over Afghanistan and Pakistan till 03 May 2022. Rise in temperatures expected over some places in Myanmar till 01 May 2022. 	
Extreme weather situations	 Heatwave conditions likely to prevail over the north western areas of the region till 01 May 2022.
