Discussion Notes

Realized Weather- Country Reports (07-13 June 24)	 While much of Bangladesh experienced increasing daytime temperatures resulting in moderate heatwave conditions, the north and northeast regions experienced heavy to very heavy rain/thundershowers. Maldives and Myanmar experienced widespread rain/thundershowers with scattered heavy to very heavy rain/thundershowers. Nepal experienced increasing daytime temperatures and below-normal rainfall in most places except in the southeastern region receiving light/moderate rain/thundershowers. Southwestern region of Sri Lanka experienced moderate to heavy rain/thundershowers, while rest of the country experienced scattered rain and afternoon thunderstorms. 	
Significant Weather Features in the region for the coming week (14-20 June 24)	 Isolated convective systems like to persist over most parts of the region. A cyclonic circulation likely to prevail over the peninsular India and adjacent areas. Conditions are favourable for the northward advancement of the southwest monsoon. 	
Weather Outlook (14-20 June 24)	 Much of Bangladesh is likely to experience increase daytime temperature with intermittent scattered rain/thundershowers, while its northern region is likely to experience moderate/heavy rain/thunderstorms. Bhutan likely to experience scattered light/moderate rain/thundershowers with isolated heavy rain/thundershowers. Maldives and Sri Lanka are likely to experience widespread rain/thundershowers with isolated heavy rain. Widespread rain/thundershowers likely over much of Myanmar with isolated heavy rain/thundershowers. Nepal likely to experience light/moderate scattered rain/thunderstorms with isolated heavy rain mainly in the southeastern region. Much of Pakistan is likely to experience dry and hot weather conditions, while scattered rain/thundershowers is likely mainly in its northern region. 	Extended Range Outlook (until 26 June 2024) A higher probability of rain (>25mm) likely over Bhutan, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Nepal, Maldives and southwest Sri Lanka towards the week ending of 26 June.

Ocean Watch • No significant events were reported. Forecast for the coming week (14-20 June 24) • Rough seas are likely over much of the coastal region over the week.
