Discussion Notes

Discussion reducts			
Realized weather (24–30 March 2022)	 Isolated rain/snow observed over the northern parts of Afghanistan and Pakistan due to passage of two shallow WDs. Heatwave conditions are observed over Afghanistan and Pakistan with isolated places experiencing severe heat. PMD reported 8-10 °C above normal temperatures in most of the Northern parts of Pakistan. Light rain/snow observed in isolated places over Bhutan and Nepal. Isolated rain/thundershowers observed over Bangladesh and Maldives with much of the places experiencing dry weather conditions. Light to moderate rain/thundershowers observed over Sri Lanka. Isolated and scattered rain/thundershowers observed over Myanmar with widespread rain/thundershowers in few paces over the northern parts of the country. Increase in day temperatures observed over Bangladesh and northern parts of Myanmar. Maldives Met Services presented updates of the cyclonic system in the southern hemisphere and reported that there were no experienced impacts observed in the southern atolls tide-gauge measurements. 		
Salient synoptic features in the coming week	 WD expected over Afghanistan and adjoining areas of Pakistan around 02 April 2022. Westerly trough approaching Bangladesh around 02 April 2022. Also, strong south westerly winds from Bay of Bengal to north eastern region at lower tropospheric level is expected. Persistence of feeble cyclonic circulation/trough over Myanmar. 		
Rainfall outlook	 Isolated rain/thundershowers expected mostly over the northern parts of Afghanistan and adjoining areas of Pakistan. Isolated and scattered rain/thundershowers likely over Bangladesh, Bhutan, Myanmar, Maldives, Nepal and Sri Lanka. 	Extended Range Outlook (until 13 April 2022) • Warm temperature anomalies continue in the northern parts of the region with 2-6 °C anomaly in maximum temperatures over most areas, and exceeding 8 °C in some places.	
Temperature outlook	 Heatwave conditions are prevailing over Afghanistan and Pakistan with isolated places experiencing severe heat. Increase in day temperatures likely over Bhutan, Nepal and northern parts of Myanmar. 		

Extreme weather situations	Heatwave conditions likely to prevail over the north western areas of the region.
